"But Jesus said, "You feed them." "With what?" they asked.
"We'd have to work for months to earn enough money to buy
food for all these people!" <sup>38</sup> "How much bread do you have?" he

have five loaves of bread and two fish." <sup>39</sup> Then Jesus told the
disciples to have the people sit down in groups on the green
grass. <sup>40</sup> So they sat down in groups of fifty or a hundred. <sup>41</sup>
Jesus took the five loaves and two fish, looked up toward
heaven, and blessed them...

...Then, breaking the loaves into pieces, he kept giving the bread to the disciples so they could distribute it to the people. He also divided the fish for everyone to share. <sup>42</sup> They all ate as much as they wanted, <sup>43</sup> and afterward, the disciples picked up twelve baskets of leftover bread and fish. <sup>44</sup> A total of 5,000 men and their families were fed.

About three o'clock in the morning Jesus came toward them, walking on the water.
